

6th Grade Religion students will come to see their faith as a spiritual journey. As they journey, they have the gospels and scripture to lead them, as well as Christian morality and the promise of God’s grace through reception of the sacraments. The journey of faith is a life-long process that leads each of us to salvation in the glory of God. Students will learn and practice the value of prayer as they master prayer recites. They will honor the gifts God has given them through stewardship so that all may come to know them as Children of God. They will work to master and model the skills of self-discipline so that they can be productive and contributing members of the school, their home, and their community.
